The Indiana Department of Education and Commission for Higher Education are providing all K-12 students with a grade-specific student success mini-magazine, OnTrack. The easy-to-read publications provide helpful information on topics such as study skills, academic standards, ISTEP+, Core 40, career exploration, planning and preparing for college, study strategies and tips for parents.

An application on the Twenty-first Century Scholars Program is included in the publications for grades 6, 7 and 8 publications. The program provides tuition at any participating Indiana college or university for income-eligible students in grades 6 through 8 who fulfill a pledge of good citizenship.

Magazines are available at school for K-12 students. The magazine for juniors and seniors, NEXT Indiana: A Guide to Life after High School, was shipped to every public and accredited nonpublic high school. The booklets provide links to additional resources including Learn More Indiana — the state's college and career connection.
